

DRAFT LIST OF LOCAL HERITAGE ASSETS OF THE CITY OF NOTTINGHAM
(09/12/2013)

*The core of this list is one drawn up for internal use by officers in the City Planning Department in the 1990s(?) and deposited in the County Archives; it was a list of street addresses with no other information. Some corrections have been made and some details added. Information appearing **in italics** is all new - the result of research undertaken prior to publication of this draft. Such information is missing in many cases and needs to be added when the necessary research has been done.*

The list also contains new entries marked with an initial asterisk. (). These are the outcome of research whose aim has been to identify other assets deserving of inclusion in an updated list. **The draft list of this date should not be regarded as complete; there are doubtless other assets that could and should be added.***

It should be noted that some of the assets below are situated within a Conservation Area. This does not clash with guidance from English Heritage on the composition of Local Lists: "If an unlisted asset has already been identified as making a positive contribution to the character of a Conservation Area, it is clearly a suitable candidate for the Local List." At this stage, however, it has not been possible either to ensure that all unlisted assets in Conservation Areas are included, or to indicate which assets in the "inherited" list lie within a Conservation Area.

**Johnson Arms PH 1912, by Frederick Ball for FW Johnson on site of old Abbey Tavern. Re-ordered inside but retains dark green faience façade and evidence of a Shipstones heritage.*

**Former Generous Briton PH. Name preserved in glazed tiles over entrance - sole surviving element of splendid tiled façade (1912) by Fredk Ball for J Shipstone & Sons.*

*The Moot PH *Fairly recent conversion. Stepped gable over entrance.*

*27-31 *Good red/brown brickwork on upper floors. Group value*

*27c/ The Duke of Devonshire PH *Baily and Eberlin 1931, for the Home Brewery Co. Landmark building on triangular site.*

*Former White Lion PH (corner of Alfred St, across from D of D). *WB Starr & Hall, 1935. Empty and neglected. Exterior features of interest: square plaques or tiles, now painted over; showing foaming tankards etc. and advertising Games Room.*

*68-70/Wedgwood House, corner of Dakeyne St. *Wm Woodsend, 1907, house and surgery for Dr W Thompson. Arts & Crafts features. Original name "Balbegno" visible over*

Wright's 1922 shows this to be the premises of the Parish Medical Officer and Public Vaccinator for Bestwood Park and Bulwell, with Dr C-W resident next door.*

*Former Christ Church/Methodist New Connexion Chapel, now Seventh Day Adventist Church *AH Goodall 1882, fronted with rugged Bulwell stone.*

*62/HSBC Bank 1904, *AN. Bromley for Nottm Joint Stock Bank.*

*Former Salvation Army Citadel, now Mt Zion 7th Day Church of God/Bulwell Community Church. *1908, with 7 commemorative foundation stones. Red brick, with glazed red brick to frontage*

*116/Former Scots Grey PH 1884 *3-storey, corner site, brick with stone dressings, Gothic arched windows, terracotta decoration; prominent chimney flue and stack on side elevation.*

*130/Middleton House *2 storey, stone, 3 bays with modern shop windows. Occupant claims this to be the oldest building in Bulwell centre. Pre-C19.*

*Former Three crowns PH (corner of Linby St.) *AE Eberlin 1928, Brewers' Tudor. Now divided and in business and residential use*

Cullen Memorial Homes *12 almshouses erected for the Misses Cullen in memory of brother James (d.1878). Now known as Cullens Court.*

*429-443. *Late C19 semi-detached villas by WA Heazell continuing red brick theme northwards from the listed Fothergill houses and Cullen Court. Steepish gables, bargeboards, and some with original wooden porch. Gatepost of 441-443/Warwick Mount (1887) bears name Sunny Side. Best decorative brickwork and terracotta is on the more northerly houses. End house Warwick Towers has corner turret with spire, echoed on the other side of Devon Drive by modern small-scale Methodist Church, which enhances the group value of this long series of red brick buildings in different styles..*

*457-467 (corner of Percival Rd) *Robinson's Almshouses. 12 dwellings by Evans & Jolley. Red brick with large panel commemorating opening in 1889..*

*No.513 (corner of Broxtowe St.) *former bank by Fredk Ball, 1911 for Nottm and Notts Banking Co.*

*Former Lloyds Bank (lately a Police Station) and remainder of shopping terrace as far as Sherwood Manor PH *AJ Thraves 1929. Tile-hung, half-timbered/mock Tudor; corner entrance flanked by classical columns.*

Mansfield Rd (east side / evens) NG3

*210-218 *Individual houses north of No. 208 (W Fothergill). Substantial late Victorian villas of brick and stone with various decorative features.*

*Mansfield Court *1936, CFW Haseldine, architect of Halifax House, Milton St (1936-7) and St Helier flats, 1950, Clumber Rd East.. Apartment block of dark brown brick with contrasting white balconies. Strong horizontal lines and Deco features. (metal windows). Hexagonal porch/staircase towers at each end.*
