- No booking is required for any of the walks and, other than in exceptional circumstances, they will go ahead regardless of the weather.
- Dates, starting times and meeting places are different for each walk, so please check the details carefully.
- Walks may be cancelled at short notice if government or other restrictions are introduced.
- Walks average between 1 and 2 miles in length and can take up to 2½ hours, but the pace is very steady.
