

## How to get there by public transport

**Canal Walk:** services 5, 6, 7, 8 or 9 from Angel Row (A2); **Clifton Village:** services 1 or 1a from Beastmarket Hill (B2); **Old Basford:** services 70 or 71 from Milton Street (T3); **Rock Cemetery and Mapperley Park:** services 15, 16 or 17 from Milton Street (T1 & T2); **Wilford:** NET tram to Meadows Embankment stop, Queen's Walk; **Wollaton Park:** service Two from Victoria Centre or 30 from Milton Street (J5).

### Please note

- No booking is required for any of the walks and, other than in exceptional circumstances, they will go ahead regardless of the weather.
- Dates, starting times, and meeting places are different for each walk, so please check the details carefully.
- Walks average about 1-2 miles in length and can take up to 2½ hours, but the pace is very steady.
- Please be mindful of traffic when in areas with narrow footpaths and respect private property when on a walk.
- Private or group walks can be arranged - contact us.

## Georgian Nottingham

## Lace Market

A detailed look at how the Lace Market area developed through the centuries to become a national centre of the lace trade.

## Mapperley Park

A guided walk around a part of Nottingham that was developed in the early 20th century to become a highly desirable suburb.

## Nottingham Canal

From Trent Bridge to Wilford Street lock, looking at canal features, its history, and links to the adjacent historic sites.

## Victorian Walk

A look at how Victorian society changed part of Nottingham, and how its architecture transformed the city landscape.

A look at this historic village from both sides of the River Trent, highlighting the old ferry crossing and the village's fine buildings.

## Wollaton Park
